Laudato Si' Roll-out Plan

This year we are celebrating the Special Anniversary Year of Laudato Si'

24 May 2021

under the invitation of Pope Francis:

A commitment to complete the transition to integral ecology by 2030, involving the whole of the Catholic world.

Back in 2018 scientists raised an alarm:

Unless by 2030 we reverse the current trends in carbon emissions, the dramatic climate changes we are already experiencing will become irreversible.

From then came a renewed sense of urgency, which suggested the need to speed up the Transformation envisaged in **Laudato Si'.**

The Dicastery for the **Promotion**of Integral Human Development (DPIHD)

backbook tacked with the overall direction

has been tasked with the overall direction of the initiative.

It has then involved many partners and various domains within the Catholic community.

One such domain is that of **Religious Congregations. UISG** and **USG** are therefore

a major partner of the Dicastery,

collaborating to facilitate the involvement of Congregations around the world.

There are many initiatives Religious Institutes have already started in order to promote Integral Ecology. But there is also a need to move on together, in communion and forming a critical mass for systemic change. As Pope Francis stated,

"Interdependence obliges us to think of one world with a common plan." LS 164

What is Laudato Si' Action Platform?

It is the overall framework worked out by the Dicastery – (DPIHD) for the various institutions to begin the 7-Year Journey towards Integral Ecology in the Spirit of Laudato Si'.

During this **Laudato Si'** Special Anniversary Year, there will be the launch of the Program and a Public Commitment from the Institutions to begin the Journey. It will be officially launched on **May 24th, 2021.**

- 1. Laudato Si' Families (Families embarking
- a 7-year journey towards integral ecology)
- 2. Laudato Si' Dioceses (Dioceses/Parishes)
- 3. Laudato Si' Schools
- 4. Laudato Si' Universities (Universities/Colleges)
- 5. Laudato Si' Hospitals / Health Care Centres
- 6. Laudato Si' Businesses/Agricultural Farms, etc.
- 7. Laudato Si' Religious Orders

Participating Communities, Congregations, Institutes will commit themselves to this 7 year journey to complete their transition to Integral Ecology, in order to reach a critical mass for radical transformation, necessary for systemic change. In fact, social scientists tell us that when 21-25% of a population embraces change, then the social system will change.

After a wide and frequent consultation with JPIC Promoters, 4 criteria have been put that would characterize a possible initiative involving the Religious in a shared journey:

✓ The process should build on what Religious communities are already doing: not only will It mean to tap into their creativity and existing initiatives, but it is the realistic way of building a movement for Integral Ecology.

- ✓ It should be inspiring enough to motivate: communities need to see in this initiative an opportunity to live their Charism and their Prophetic Mission to the fullest.
- ✓ Flexible enough to suit different situations and contexts: a process suggests a sense of direction and essential points of reference.For the rest, participants will have all the freedom of the children of God.

✓ It should be simple and gradual enough to be manageable: communities are often already overstretched by many commitments and with limited number of personnel.

The process, therefore need not scare them away from making a commitment.

What are the Laudato Si' Goals?



Greater use of clean renewable energy and reducing fossil fuels in order to achieve carbon neutrality, efforts to

protect and promote biodiversity, guaranteeing access to clean water for all, etc.




Defence of human life from conception to death and all forms of life on Earth, with special attention to vulnerable groups such as

indigenous communities, migrants, children at risk through slavery, etc.




sustainable production, fair-trade, ethical consumption, ethical investments, divestment from

fossil fuels and any economic activity harmful to the planet and the people, investment in renewable energy, etc.




Sobriety in the use of resources and energy, avoid single-use plastic, adopt a more plant-based diet and

reduce meat consumption, greater use of public transport and avoid polluting modes of transportation, etc.



Re-think and re-design educational curricula and educational institution reform in the spirit of integral ecology to create

ecological awareness and action, promoting the ecological vocation of young people, teachers and leaders of education etc.



Recover a religious vision of God's creation, encourage greater contact with the natural world in a spirit of

wonder, praise, joy and gratitude, promote creation-centred liturgical celebrations, develop ecological catechesis, prayer, retreats, formation, etc.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AND PARTICIPATORY ACTION

To care for creation at the local, regional, national and international levels promote advocacy and people's campaigns,

encourage rootedness in local territory and neighbourhood ecosystems, etc.

Expected Outcome

We hope that the engagement with Laudato Si' will greatly influence our understanding of being Missionaries Today. Taking into account that our responsibilities go beyond the direct care of the human persons, we cannot ignore the care of the entire creation, because everything is connected.

We have lived and continue to live this interconnectedness, as we see concretely in many parts of our world that *climate change* is one of the root causes of conflicts, migration and poverty.

Our Constitutions state:

Our Precious Blood Spirituality challenges us to become instruments of reconciliation, justice and peace and to preserve the integrity of creation" Const. 507

During the Provincials'/Regionals' Meeting in June 2019 in Heilig Bloed, we said: It is strongly recommended that Sisters be motivated to make JPIC a way of life which becomes evident in prayer, community, living of vows, finances, care of the environment, etc. Sisters are encouraged to use Laudato Si' as resource material for ongoing formation.

Laudato Si' Values then become:

- ✓a lifestyle for every CPS Sister,
- ✓a project for every CPS community,
- ✓ a way of life in our Congregation.

And so

> Are we ready to make a commitment as communities, Provinces/Regions, Congregation to do something to address the ecological crisis and to participate in the Laudato Si' Roll-Out-Plan of the DPIHD?

>How could we creatively engage with the Laudato Si' Goals within each one's reach and existing apostolates, so that we can gradually grow together into an Integral Ecological Conversion?

➤ How can we collaborate with others outside our Congregation?
