In Sr Martha-Ann's own hand written message, her wish was not to have an Obituary written after her death. We respect her wish and therefore, we will record only the most important events of her life as a Religious Sister in our Congregation.

Sr Martha-Ann Dlamini, daughter of the late Simohlele and Rebecca Dlamini, was born on 12 September 1946 in the city of Umzimkhulu, South Africa. On 21 December 1960, she entered the Congregation of the Missionary Sisters of the Precious Blood at Glen Avent Convent, Mthatha. She was received into the Novitiate on 6 January 1964 and made her First Profession of Vows on 8 July 1965. Lastly, she made her Final Commitment to the Lord forever on 6 January 1971.

The following are the Mission stations she served mainly as a cook: Firstly, at Glen Avent Convent and thereafter in Lumko, Mariannhill Hospital, St Patrick's Mission, Cofimvaba, Farview, Mother House, Netherlands, Cwele and finally in Mariazell. In 2018 she came to Glen Avent Convent where she did mending for the sisters.

Shortly before her eminent death, Sr Martha-Ann had difficulties in walking even with the aid of a walker. It was then decided that she be taken care of by the Infirmary staff in all her needs. Unexpectedly, in the early hours of the morning of 13 June 2020, Sr Martha-slept quietly to COVID-19 related illnesses.
